

Release of books on “Forest Biodiversity in India” and “Forest Sector Report India 2010” by Smt. Jayanthi Natarajan, Hon’ble Minister of State, Environment and Forests, Government of India in presence of DG, ICFRE during COP-11, Hyderabad on 17th October

The report gives details of the forestry sector activities like investment in the forestry sector, international conventions related to the sector, National Afforestation Programme, use of modern technology like GIS in forest management, contribution of the forests to the Indian economy, development of Non- Timber Forest resources, management of human resources, etc.
