## Visit of Dr. S. C. Gairola, *IFS*, Director General, Indian Council of Forestry Research & Education (ICFRE) to Tropical Forest Research Institute, Jabalpur (M.P.).

A pictorial catalogue named "Birds of TFRI campus" an elaborate and painstaking work of Dr. Sumit Chakrabartihaving collection of 170 resident and migratory birds of the institute campus was also released by DG, ICFRE.
